# **Surrounding School Districts**

Many military families and contractors assigned to Naval Support Activity Mid-South choose to live in either Shelby or Tipton County. Families living in the following counties should take comfort in knowing that the superintendents, administrators, and faculties of these school districts are eager and ready to serve their educational needs. The following Individual School, and District wide, data was populated using the following references:

Enrollment: TN Dept. of Education
Grades Served: TN Dept. of Education

Military Student Population: TN Dept. of Education, Office of Impact Aid Programs

**Chronically Out of School:** TN Dept. of Ed.—The chronically out of school indicator measures school, district and state chronic absenteeism. A student is considered chronically out of school if he or she misses 10 percent or more of school days for any reason. A school, district, or the state can perform well on this indicator if the school, district or state has a low chronic absenteeism rater or significantly reduces its chronic absenteeism rate.

**Success Rate:** TN Dept. of Education— The one year success rate represents the percentage of students that scored on track or mastered on annual state tests.

**Ready Graduate:** TN Dept. of Ed.—The Ready Graduate rate represents the percentage of students who demonstrate readiness for postsecondary and career. For 2017-18, a Ready Graduate is a student who graduated on time in 2017 and earned a composite ACT score of 21 or higher. Additional pathways related to early postsecondary opportunities, industry certifications, and military readiness will be included in future years.

**Graduation Rate:** TN Dept of Ed.—The graduation rate represents the percentage of students who graduate on time with a regular high school diploma. Graduating on time is defined as graduating within four years and a summer.

**Average ACT Composite:** TN Dept. of Education

**CTE Concentrators:** TN Dept. of Ed.—The CTE Concentrators rate represents the percentage of students in the graduation class who graduated AND concentrated in Career and Technical Education. A student is recognized for having concentrated in Career and Technical Education if the student completes three or more credits within a career cluster or CTE program of study.

**English:** TN Dept. of Ed.—The English Language arts (ELA) achievement rate represents the total number of ELA tests on which students scored on track or mastered divided by the total number of English Language arts assessments. The assessments included in this rate are: Grades 3-8 English Language Arts, English II, English III.

Math: TN Dept. of Ed.—The mathematics achievement rate represents the total number of mathematic tests on which students scored on track or mastered divided by the total number of mathematics assessments. The assessments included in this rate are: Grades 3-8 Math, Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Integrated Math 1, Integrated Math II, and Integrated Math III.

**Overall Student Growth:** TN Dept. of Ed.—Overall growth provides and indication as to the amount of growth achieved by students in the school or district, regardless of whether or not the student is on grade level. Based on the growth achieved by their students, the school is assigned a level between 1 and Level 5, with Level 5 being the highest.

The schools in the local area work closely with Naval Support Activity Mid-South to offer quality educational services to children in the military community.



# **Welcome to Naval Support Activity Mid-South**

A part of the Navy Region Southeast and the Navy Installations Command, NSA Mid-South serves as the Navy's Human Resources Center of Excellence. Headquartered onboard NSA Mid-South are Navy Personnel Command, Navy Recruiting Command, the Navy Manpower Analysis Center, as well as the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Finance Center. More than 7,500 military, civilian, and contract personnel are assigned/work on base.

NSA Mid-South, located in Millington, Tennessee, just north of Memphis, serves as the Navy's Human Resources Center of Excellence. We are continuing our goal to become the Navy's premiere support installation by striving to maintain excellence in our facilities and services. # **School Choice**



When it comes to a child's education, perhaps nothing causes parents more anxiety than having to choose the *right* school. For military parents, this decision is further complicated by having to choose schools which may be in other parts of the United States or in a different country all together.

In either case, parents have a responsibility to research schools in a given area to determine if the schools can meet the needs of both the family and/or the child. When choosing a school, parents must consider several factors, including but not limited to, the following:

- price (if private schools are preferred)
- location
- school size
- class size
- academic rating (vary from state to state)
- level of discipline

- extra-curricular activities
- special needs of child
- parental involvement
- ♦ schools reputation
- facilities

The biggest challenge faced by parents is deciding which of these factors are most important and which ones will be important in the life of the child and family. In the end, parents act as the first and primary advocates for their children and their children's education. Therefore, it is important for military parents to take the time to find out all the can about schools at their duty station.

Parents should feel free to contact the local school administrators to address any specific questions or concerns they may have about the information provided in the school's report. The School Liaison Officer is available to answer general

education questions and to offer assistance but is not at liberty to recommend the "best" school for any child or family. Choosing a school or academic program for a family or child remains the responsibility of the military parent and/or guardian.

# **School Start Dates**



Tennessee allows local school boards to establish individual school calendars which include opening and closing dates, holiday schedules and teacher staff development days. Listed below are the school start dates for each of the 8 local districts served by the School Liaison Officer.

# **Entry Age Requirement**

A child must be five years old on or before August 15 to enter a public Kindergarten. However, a child does not have to enroll in school at five years of age, but enrollment must occur no later than the child's sixth birthday. Any transfer student applying for admission who was legally enrolled in an approved Kindergarten in another state and who will be five years of age no later than December 31 of the current school year, shall be enrolled. So, a child entering school during the fall from another state may enter Kindergarten as long as the child turns five that calendar year and was enrolled in an approved kindergarten in the other state. A Child must have attended an approved Kindergarten program to be considered eligible to enter first grade.

As a member of the Interstate Compact, Tennessee allows military students transferring from an accredited school to continue enrollment at the current level, be eligible for enrollment in the next higher grade, and continue participation in honors, gifted and talented programs regardless of age. The receiving school DOES retain the right to confirm the placement by conduction separate academic assessments.

# **Transfer and Admission Procedures**

Military families moving to Tennessee and planning to enroll children in local public schools should contact the office of the superintendent where they will be living to determine what registration and/or transfer requirements have been established. Registration is typically held in the spring, with additional registration dates prior to the start of school. Registration policies vary from district to district.

Following Interstate Compact guidelines, Tennessee allows local school districts to accept unofficial records from military families for registration purposes. Local schools may enroll and place students in classes based on the information contained in the unofficial records pending validation by the official records from the sending school. If possible, it is a good idea to request that student's academic and discipline records be forwarded to the student's new school at the time the student officially withdraws from the previous or sending school.

Although schools are closed during the summer, there are typically office staff and administrators available to answer questions regarding registration and/or enrollment. Contacting the School Liaison Officer prior to the move may offer some assistance especially where students with special needs are concerned.

# **Attendance Policies**

State law grants local boards of education the authority to establish attendance policies. Those policies must be developed with the following guidelines:

- (1) Attendance policies shall be firm but fair so that each student has a reasonable opportunity to meet the minimum requirements;
- (2) Effective accounting and reporting procedures shall be developed to keep parents or guardians informed of a student's absence from class;
- (3) Policies shall accommodate extenuating circumstances created by emergencies over which the student has no control;
- (4) Appeal procedures shall be included to assure the student's right of due process; and
- (5) Alternative programs shall be established to provide educational options for any student who severely fails to meet minimum attendance requirements.

Under newly adopted legislation, military students MAY be granted additional absences if a parent or legal guardian is an active duty military member and has been called to duty for, is on leave from, or has immediately returned from a combat zone or combat support posting. These additional absences, IF granted, are intended to allow the student to visit with his or her parent or legal guardian as a result of the leave of deployment. Parents should seek guidance from their respective school administrators to determine eligibility for these additional absences.

For details regarding a district's individual attendance policy parents should contact their local school district.

# Immunization Requirements

Tennessee Requires the following immunizations:

## **Children enrolling in Kindergarten:**

- Hepatitis B (HBV)
- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP, or DT if appropriate)
- Poliomyelitis (IPV or OPV) final dose on or after the 4th birthday
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella 2 doses of each, usually given together as MMR
- Varicella 2 doses or credible history of disease
- Hepatitis A total of 2 doses, spaced at least 6 18 months apart

# All children entering 7th grade (including currently enrolled students)

- Tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis booster (Tdap) evidence of one Tdap dose given any time before 7th grade entry is required regardless of Td history
- Varicella 2 doses or credible history of disease

## Children who are new enrollees in a TN school in grades other than Kindergarten:

- Hepatitis B (HBV)
- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP, or DT if appropriate)
- Poliomyelitis (IPV or OPV final dose on or after the 4th birthday
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella 2 doses of each, normally given together as MMR
- Varicella 2 doses or credible history of disease
- New students entering grades other than 7th grade are not required to have Tdap

# **PLEASE REMEMBER!**

Required immunizations must be documented on the Official TN Immunization Certificate. Military families may hand deliver immunization records to the Branch Medical clinic, whose personnel will transfer the records onto the necessary Tennessee form. These forms must be signed by a Tennessee physician and are best completed after arrival. For more detailed information contact the Immunizations Department at the Branch Medical Clinic by calling (901) 874-6129.

# **Special Education Services**

Local schools make every effort to accommodate students with special needs. Parents of these children should ensure that the necessary documentation is available upon arrival—copies of current IEPS, 504 Plan documents, assessments, etc. These documents may be presented to school officials at the time of enrollment.

Legislation in most cases, will allow students to continue services documented on an IEP or other official special education document until the local education agency or school can conduct it's own evaluation to confirm placement and the necessity for continued services. Schools may accept copies of important special needs documents until the official documents can be forwarded from the previous school.

Families with special needs considerations may wish to contact the School Liaison Officer or the local school to assist them with accessing the continuity of care needed to support the learning of children with special needs. Active duty service members should contact the **Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) at (901) 874-5075**. The EFMP office is located at the Fleet and Family Support Center, Community Services Bldg. 456.

# **Extracurricular Activities**

Opportunities to participate in extracurricular activities are available to students in elementary, middle and high school. The types and number of programs available vary from school to school. Depending on the age of the students being served, schools may offer programs either during or after school. Information about these programs, registration deadlines and eligibility requirements will be sent home with students at the appropriate times throughout the school year.

Secondary students wishing to continue participation in sporting or club activities that require audition or try outs are advised to contact the school prior to their arrival to schedule times to meet with program directors. Athletes may consider making game tapes or other records of accomplishments available to the Athletic Director or sports coach for preliminary review. Upon arrival, there MAY be opportunity to make an appointment for try outs or audition to gain a place



Tennessee is a member of the Interstate Compact which states that "local school systems will facilitate the opportunity for transitioning military students to be included in extracurricular activities, regardless of deadlines, to the extent they are 'otherwise qualified." While this is a great opportunity for our military community, students and their families must be diligent about making their desire for participation known. Schools are NOT required to hold a place for military children. Therefore, early contact may facilitate a student's eligibility for participation.

# **Transportation**



The Transportation Departments of schools located in Shelby and Tipton County seek to provide students with bus services that are safe, dependable, professional, and cost effective. Millington Municipal Schools offers transportation, through Durham School Services, to students living on-base and has designated bus stops throughout base housing. There is also a bus stop located at the NSAMS Youth Center, which provides before and after school care for students, and an afternoon bus stop at the Teen Center.

Riding the local public school bus is a privilege and all students are expected to obey bus rules regarding student behavior. Failure to do so could result in bus incidence reports being made to local school administrators and possible suspension. The rules that govern the buses are designed to promote safety for all students. The rules help to minimize distractions and obstructions for the driver and alleviate situations that could be potentially dangerous.

Bus riders are asked to arrive at designated bus stop locations no later than 20 minutes before the scheduled pick-up time. Students' early arrival helps ensure that the busses can run in a timely and orderly manner.

Parents are reminded that the center aisle of the bus and the emergency exits must remain clear at ALL times. Therefore, the following items should not be brought onto the bus:

- Science fair boards
- Large athletic equipment
- Large band instruments
- Glass
- Animals and insects (alive or dead)

Students may bring other items on the bus that fit in their laps and will not obstruct any emergency exits. For more information about transportation related issues, please contact your schools Transportation Department.

For information regarding your child's bus stop/route, please contact your school directly.

# **Standardized Testing**

Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program (TCAP): Students' skills and academic progress are measured by a set of statewide assessments called the TCAP. TCAP measures how well students have learned the knowledge and skills outlined in the state-adopted content standards in language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies. The results of these assessments are reported to parents, teachers and administrators and can be found on the TCAP Results page or the annual Report Card, released each fall.

### **REQUIRED TESTING**

- TCAP for Grades 3-8
- TCAP End-of-Course Assessments High School
- Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) English language arts and math for students in grades 3-8 and grade 11 with significant cognitive disabilities.
- TCAP-Alt Assessment for science and social studies for students with the significant cognitive disabilities.
- ACCESS For English Learners Assessment of ELLs to determine language proficiency.
- ACT and SAT Students in Tennessee are required to take a college entrance exam (either the ACT or SAT) in the eleventh grade. This is now a graduation requirement for student seeking a regular or honors diploma. Districts in Tennessee contract with ACT to provide an opportunity to take the ACT at their own school during the school day at no cost to the student.
- National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) The largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what America's students know and can do in various subject areas. Only a small sample of Tennessee fourth, eighth and twelfth graders will take this test. These groups are chosen by NAEP each year.

When possible, parents of students scheduled for state testing are advised to complete testing in the sending state before moving to a new duty station. This affords students greater opportunity for success and provides the receiving faculty the most current information about a student's level of performance.

Military parents considering relocation to a new school district should know the standardized testing dates for each district and strategically plan relocations accordingly. Typically, students enrolled in a public school at the time of testing are required to take the state's standardized tests.



# **Tennessee High School Graduation**

The Tennessee Department of Education has raised standards and aligned graduation requirements to best prepare students for college and the workforce.

Following the implementation of the Tennessee Diploma Project in 2009, high school students must complete 22 credits to graduate. They also will be tested in core subject areas with End of Course exams, part of the Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program, or TCAP. Their performance on these exams will factor into their semester grade for the course.





# **Total Required Credits: 22**

- Math: 4 credits, including Algebra I, II, Geometry and a fourth higher level math course (Students must be enrolled in a mathematics course each school year.)
- English: 4 credits
- Science: 3 credits, including Biology, Chemistry or Physics, and a third lab course
- ◆ Social Studies: 3 credits, including U.S. History and Geography, World History and Geography, U.S. Government and Civics, and Economics
- ◆ Physical Education and Wellness: 1.5 credits
- Personal Finance: 0.5 credits (Three years of JROTC may be substituted for one-half unit of Personal Finance if the JROTC instructor attends the Personal Finance training.)
- Foreign Language: 2 credits (May be waived by the local school district for students, under certain circumstances, to expand and enhance the elective focus)
- Fine Arts: 1 credit (may be waived by the local school district for students, under certain circumstances, to expand and enhance the elective focus)
- ♦ Elective Focus: 3 credits consisting of Math and Science, Career and Technical Education, Fine Arts, Humanities, Advanced Placement (AP) or International Baccalaureate (IB)

# **Tennessee Driver's Education Requirements**

## To enroll in a Driver's Ed course, you must:

- Be at least 15 years old.
- Already have your Tennessee learner's permit.

### To get your learner's permit, you must:

- Be at least 15 years old.
- Pass a vision test.
- Pass the driver's license written exam.
- Have your parent or guardian sign your application.
- Prove you are currently enrolled in school.
- Prove your identity and TN residency.



Although driver's education is not usually required, if you get 2 moving violations while on your restricted driver's license, you MUST complete Driver's Ed before you can graduate to an unrestricted TN driver's license. Driver's Ed courses are offered at TN public schools. Approved third-party driving schools, which may offer courses of different lengths and formats, including online driver's education are also available. Costs for these courses vary, so check with a local school for specific information.

Classroom or online Driver's Ed instruction typically covers the information and theories that are essential to safe driving.

# Topics may include:

- TN driving laws, violations, and penalties.
- Ways to avoid distracted driving.
- Safe vehicle operation.
- Driving in emergencies and hazardous conditions.
- The effects of alcohol on driving.
- Behind-the-Wheel Instruction

- Behind-the-wheel instruction is practical driving instruction in a car with dual controls.
- The instructor will teach you skills and techniques to use in the operation of a vehicle, building your skills and confidence as a safe driver.
- Types of Driver's Ed Courses

If completing the course through a third-party provider, make sure they have been certified by the TN Department of Safety.

# **Driver's Education (continued)**

# After Driver's Ed – Getting Your TN License

Taking Driver's Ed is a great way to acquire the skills you need to get your first Tennessee driver's license.

### To get your intermediate license, you must:

- Be at least 16 years old
- Have held your learner's permit for at least 180 days
- Complete 50 hours of supervised behind-the-wheel experience, including 10 hours at night, verified with the Certification of 50 Hours of Behind the Wheel Driving Experience (Form SF-1256)
- Pass a driving test, also called a road skills test

- Driver's Ed will help you make the most of your supervised behind-the-wheel experience and prepare you for the DOS road skills test



# **In-State Tuition**

For periods of enrollment that begin after July 1, 2009, members of the armed forces (Army, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard) on active duty for a period of more than 30 days and his or her spouse, or his or her dependent children, will be eligible to receive in-state tuition at public college and university in the state when they reside or are permanently stationed. Once a service member or their family members are enrolled, and paying in-state tuition, they will continue to pay the in-state tuition at the institution, even if the service member is reassigned outside the state. This change, signed into law August 14, 2008, is included in section 135 of the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 1965 (HEA).

The Department of Education has worked to ensure that all institutions are aware of and appropriately implement this program. However, should service members or family members experience any difficulties in gaining access to this program they should contact the Office of Education Ombudsman's office at

1-877-557-2575. Questions regarding this program and its implementation can be answered there.

Additionally, High School Seniors may apply for the **Tennessee Promise scholarship**, which will provide two years of tuition-free attendance at a community or technical college in Tennessee. # **Homeschool Information**

Parents in Tennessee may choose to home school their own children in grades K - 12. The Tennessee Home School law (Tennessee Code Annotated § 49-6-3050) states: "A home school is a school conducted or directed by a parent or parents or a legal guardian or guardians for their own children." Parents desiring to home school their own children may do so by choosing one of the following three options.

### **Independent Home School:**

Parents choosing this educational option should begin by contacting the local school district. The parent will be required to complete an Intent to Home School form and provide evidence of a high school diploma or GED. Student attendance (at least 4 hours per day, 180 days per year) must be reported to the local school district at the end of the school year. Proof of vaccination and receipt of any health services or examinations, as required by law, must also be submitted. Testing of independent home school students is required in grades 5, 7, and 9 and coordinated through the local school district.

### **Church-related Umbrella School:**

Parents may also home school their own children by registering with a church-related "umbrella" school defined by Tennessee Code Annotated § 49-50-801. Parents who choose this option will be required to provide evidence to the local school district that their child is enrolled in a church-related school. An Intent to Home School form is not required for students who enrolled in a church-related school. The church-related school will determine record keeping and test requirements for students enrolled in an umbrella program.

### **Accredited Online School:**

Parents may also enroll their child in an accredited online school. Parents choosing this educational option must be sure to determine that the school has legitimate accreditation status and will be required to provide evidence to the local school district that their child is enrolled in an accredited online school. To be an acceptable online school for students who reside in Tennessee, the school must be accredited by one of regional accrediting agencies.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

### What is a School Liaison Officer and how can they help me?

School Liaison Officers (SLO) help by providing you with educational information on your new area (based on residence) and can also connect you with a SLO at your next duty station. SLOs also offer resources on deployment support, are the liaison between command, schools and military families, work with commands and schools on the Partnership in Education program, can help families navigate the special needs programs in districts, and offer information and support for Home School and Post-Secondary preparation.

### How do I choose a school?

We know the importance of choosing a school that best meets the needs of your military child(ren). Even though we are unable to make direct recommendations for schools, we are available to help you acquire information and research the schools in the NSA Mid-South area. We can provide overall information on districts as well as help you determine what schools you might be mapped to once you have a residence.

### What are the health and immunization requirements?

Immunization and health checkup fact sheet for the Tennessee Dept of Education can be found at: http://tn.gov/health/article/childcare-12th-grade-immunization-requirements. Once you determine where you will live and what school your child will attend, you should also check with your school to be sure there are no additional district requirements.

### What are the School Registration procedures?

This depends on what school district you are looking to enroll your child in. We recommend that once you establish residence, that you contact the school directly.

### What do I do if I'm on a housing wait-list or am in temporary housing?

Most military housing areas and school districts within school boundaries of military housing are familiar with this situation. We recommend that you ask your local housing office for a letter that indicates that you are on the waitlist. Most times this is all the schools need to proceed with registration. If you have questions or issues, please contact your SLO.

### What options are there for before and after school care?

We recommend that you start looking for care early! As soon as you arrive and have registered your child in school, begin by asking your school or district what they offer. This is many times the best option, particularly if they offer on-site care. If they don't, many times the school will know what is available close to the school or in your community. If you are still having difficulty, contact your School Liaison Officer and they will work with you to try to find other options. Also, if you are living on base the Child and Youth Programs offer before and after school child care services.

### What is the Interstate Compact and what can it do for my family?

The Interstate Compact seeks to make transition easier for the children of military families so that they are afforded the same opportunities for educational success as other children and are not penalized or delayed in achieving their educational goals. More information can be found at: www.mic3.net.

### What do I do if I'm moving with a child with special needs?

In the Navy, your School Liaison Officer can help you with the special needs navigation of the school or district that you are planning to send your child(ren) to. You should also contact the Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) to ensure that you are enrolled and that you have all information and resources that they offer.

### Can School Liaison Officers advocate in an IEP for my child?

The Navy School Liaisons are not able to advocate on your behalf. In our program, we offer information, resources and help you find the right people to talk to at the school or district. If you ever have issues with your IEP or school, please call your School Liaison since we also have many community resources that can offer guidance and direct assistance.

### Can I enroll my student in a School District other than the one we are zoned for?

Students enrolling in public school attend their zoned school unless they have received approval for a Transfer Request. Transfer Requests must be submitted during the school's Open Enrollment period, which is typically 30 days. Transfer Requests are approved based on space availability by grade level. Transfer Requests are not accepted outside of the Open Enrollment window, with the exception of Shelby County Schools.

The following is general guidance for registering your child for school. For specific school information please contact your District Office. The following documentation is needed to register your child for school.

**TWO** proofs of residence. The following items are approved for proof of residence:

- Valid driver's license or state-issued ID
- Current Memphis Light, Gas and Water (MLGW) bill
- Lease/rental agreement
- Public assistance/government benefits form
- Real estate tax receipt
- Municipal water bill
- Mortgage statement or deed

### In addition, **ALL** of the following:

- Certified Birth Certificate (mother's copy will not be accepted) age 5 on or before August 15, 2018
- Child's social security card
- Proof of current physical and immunization record on the <u>Tennessee School Form</u>
